POP UP BIKE PARKING Key learning points:

Leicester benefited from political stability, enlightened leadership, responsive to identified multi-cultural community needs.

Leicester city centre secure parking boosted confidence in cycle use for everyday travel – a key element of increased levels of cycling.

Low tech solution, using redundant town hall space kept costs low

York: Lack of council staff resource / funding can be overcome by creative approaches – local business goodwill and dedicated volunteer activity can make it happen where the council fails.

Campaign media profile, work with local police/ bike security + marking helps to reinforce the need for secure bike parking.


